
Telegraph Map



Data Servers




Data servers are located in the US and Global North




None of the CEO's of big tech companies are woman (mainly white male, cisgender, heterosexual)

History of technology



Technology, the application of scientific knowledge to the practical aims of human life or, as it is sometimes phrased, to the change and manipulation of the human environment.



The Carrier Bag Theory of Fiction Ursula Le Guin




Los Caballos, Spain 10.000 BC
